Year 2 Infinity and Beyond...

What an amazing term the children have had. We had a brilliant trip to Winchester Science Centre. The children behaved really well and thoroughly enjoyed the hands-on exhibits, the planetarium ('which felt like you were flying into space') and the spectacular rocket workshop where they had the opportunity to build and test their own rockets. They also tried a real-life astronaut costume for size!





After the trip we all enjoyed making moon buggies and testing them, as well as writing instructions for other children to be able to make them. To make the moon buggies the children experienced using 'real saws' and wooden axles. They were very sensible and aware of the sharp blade while still enjoying using tools like a 'grown up'.



This week the children have been to visit their new teachers and had an amazing time. They have come back full of enthusiasm for Year 3 and have been making clay bookworms in their new Year 3 classes.

We will be finishing our space themed work with the text 'The Way Back Home' and inventing aliens and strange planets in our writing. There are so many events coming up in the next few weeks so please make a note of these in your diaries. Don't forget our up-and-coming 'Space Party' on Wednesday 17th July. Please do not go to any expense for costumes – it's amazing what can be done with a roll of foil!

We have had a wonderful time with your children this year and would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all of the support you have given us and to wish you all a very happy summer holiday.

We can't believe it is nearly time to say goodbye to year 3 already! This term has been jam-packed with activities – the children have been really busy!

In literacy, we have been looking the archaeologist, Howard Carter, who discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun. The children then wrote their own versions of a diary from his perspective. To help the children to imagine what it must have felt like, they used torches and took part in an artefact hunt in the darkened classrooms, using ambitious vocabulary to describe the artefacts that they found to include in their writing.












We were then able to follow this up by having an Egyptian Workshop. They learnt how the process of mummification was carried out in Ancient Egyptian times and had the opportunity to take part in some games which would have been played back in Ancient Egyptian times!



We completed one of our Curriculum Promises of creating a piece of artwork inspired by the outdoors. We took the iPads outside to take photos of clouds which we then edited to make the clouds look like other things. The children really enjoyed it and there were some great pictures created!



For science in the summer term, we had a big "push" looking at Forces and Magnets. We ran lot of experiments focusing on aspects like: how different surfaces offer varying amounts of friction, the differences between forces generated and how to measure them accurately.

Then we moved onto magnets and we had great fun exploring how they worked, how they relate to the world at large and we even designed our own magnetic games. We made instant classics like: "Gone Fishing", "Cross the Paper Bridge", "Follow the Maze" and "Monster Magnet Attack!" It "attracted" quite the crowd!



During our art lessons, the children have been exploring how to make different coloured dyes from natural resources and were then given the opportunity to tie dye their own t-shirt. The results were awesome and great fun was had by all.







Some Year 3 students thoroughly enjoyed participating in a multi-skills sporting festival. They were able to try a range of activities and particularly enjoyed the archery.

Year 4

In English, we have been studying the ancient Greek myth of Icarus and Daedalus and re-wrote this as a narrative. To help prepare them for writing, the children created freeze frames of different moments in the myth.

The children then drafted, wrote and published their own re-telling of the story of Icarus and Daedalus. This left them with a lovely finished piece to take home and share with friends and family. The children should be very proud of themselves. We hope you enjoyed reading their myths as much as we did!





On Friday 21st June, Year 4 enjoyed a trip to Ufton Court where they had several workshops to learn about objects from the Anglo-Saxon period and learn what they may have been used for. They had the opportunity to experiment using different techniques to create everyday objects from the Anglo-Saxon times. This included using brushes and a spinner to create a yarn, using a flint and steel to make a spark, and using wattle to make a weaved fence.



After lunch, we had a mock battle – the Anglo-Saxons vs the Vikings! The children were excitable but extremely well behaved and were good role-models for the school. They should be very proud of themselves.



In the heat of the June sun, the year 4 children hosted their own mock ancient Greek Olympics. The children had already learnt about the history of the Olympic games and were excited to have a go at their own version. As some of the anicent Greek events were 'interesting', we created our own interpretation with events including discus throwing, (foam) javelin, (relay) races, long jumps, (thumb) wrestling, and (bean bag) shot put. The children were fantastic, using the games cards to understand what they had to complete at each station. This Olympic afternoon was then used to inspire and invigorate their writing in English – newspaper reports!




Year 5




Computing - Making Sweet Music with Sonic Pi!

Also, from September, the current Year 2 children will no longer be eligible for FSM under the government Universal Infant Free School Meals initiative.
